The Fellowship

The Stechler Child and Adolescent Therapy Fellowship is a one-year training program for early- to mid-career mental health professionals interested in psychodynamic approaches to child and adolescent psychotherapy. Those with other orientations wanting to expand their repertoire will also benefit.

The Fellowship covers the major topics in child and adolescent treatment and is designed to help clinicians navigate common yet challenging clinical dilemmas. The Stechler program is unique to the Boston area, as it integrates contemporary and progressive psychodynamic models applicable to the kinds of clinical issues seen in current practice. It is meant to be more accessible and "user-friendly" for clinicians than its more traditional counterparts.

It is a program that will broaden and expand clinical understanding, provide an array of technical tools, and offer a collegial atmosphere for supportive professional development while engaging in this fascinating yet complicated work.

What makes Stechler unique?

FRAMEWORK

An open, flexible and accessible theoretical and clinical framework. This more contemporary than a classical model without abandoning core principles that the therapeutic relationship is the vehicle for change, and that what is manifest on the surface can disguise underlying concerns needing to be addressed.

CLINICAL SKILLS & THEORY

The acquisition of clinical skills and theory applicable to clinical work with children and adolescents, including play therapy, working with parents, working with schools, the particular issues involved in engaging adolescents, understanding and working with young people who are atypical in cognitive and/or other ways.

THE CURRICULUM

Our five didactic units are comprised of:

- Initial Evaluation and the Beginning of Treatment;
- Technique: Play Therapy and Engaging Adolescents in a Therapeutic Process;
- Attachment Theory and Application in Child and Adolescent Therapy;
- Working with Parents;
- The Child and Adolescent at School

RACE, CULTURE, & GENDER

Issues of race, culture and gender have been integrated throughout our overall curriculum. This is part of our commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion at MIP.

The Stechler Fellowship begins each Fall.

Classes meet Mondays for 24 weeks, from 7:30 to 9:30 pm in Brookline. In keeping with evolving Covid19 scenarios, classes may be in-person, online, or hybrid.
