

# The Postgraduate Fellowship Program

The MIP Postgraduate Fellowship Program is designed for mental health providers and scholars who are interested in psychoanalytic psychotherapy and theory. The program offers the opportunity to explore a wide range of models of the treatment process in terms of the historical contribution of each model as well as its current clinical application. Grounded in a contemporary, comparative, creative approach to psychoanalytic psychotherapy, the fellowship aims to enrich participants' understanding of human nature and to promote a deeper, more vital and effective clinical practice. Faculty and fellows will present their own psychotherapy cases and the fellows will have ample opportunity to discuss many of the practical issues that emerge in initiating and deepening their clinical work.

# Overview of the Fellowship

#### **BOSTON PROGRAM**

Course work consists of two closely integrated seminars, one didactic, the other clinical. Both seminars meet on Monday evenings from 7:00 P.M. to 10:00 P.M. at the Harvard Faculty Club, Quincy Street, Cambridge. There are four terms for a total of nineteen sessions, including a final review and evaluation. The number of participants in the program is limited to create optimal seminar interaction.

#### **BOSTON SECOND YEAR**

After the first year of the fellowship there may be an optional second year seminar for which all graduates of the first year program will be eligible.

#### WEST (AMHERST) PROGRAM

Course work is based on a two-part seminar, didactic and clinical. We meet for nineteen seminars from November through early May. The seminars meet on Tuesday evenings from 6:30 P.M. to 9:30 P.M. at Amherst College. The first half of each meeting consists of a lecture and discussion of readings. The second half concerns the integration of theory with clinical material. There are four terms, with a total of nineteen sessions, including a final review and reflection. The number of participants in the program is limited, in order to enhance seminar participation.

#### MIP MEMBERSHIP

Fellows automatically become members of MIP during their Fellowship and have the benefit of reduced membership fees for two years following completion of the program. As MIP members, fellows are able to participate with other MIP members in short courses held during the winter, to utilize MIP referral lists, and to vote in MIP elections.

#### **BOSTON PROGRAM DEADLINES**

The deadline for receiving applications is May 16, 2022. Applications are reviewed as they are received. Final decisions will be made by June 1st, 2022. Please note: since we are committed to the educational value of smaller seminars, the limited available spaces may well be filled before the final May 16 deadline.

#### **WEST PROGRAM DEADLINES**

We accept and process applications on a rolling admissions basis until the class is full (with a deadline of July 15). Applications are reviewed as they are received.

Optional Second Year Program: \$1,350

West Program Tuition: \$800
